AGC PAC, a separate segregated fund of the Associated General Contractors of America, is a bipartisan, multicandidate federal political action committee. Participation in AGC PAC is completely voluntary. AGC PAC is registered with the Federal Election Commission and files monthly reports of all AGC PAC receipts and candidate contributions. These reports become part of the public record at the FEC in Washington, D.C.

Criteria for Candidate Support

The AGC PAC Contributions Subcommittee determines which candidates receive AGC PAC's support, considering the following in their criteria:

- AGC PAC Contributions Subcommittee candidate discussion/conference calls
- AGC PAC contributor recommendations
- Chapter input
- AGC PAC vote record
- Issue strategy
- In-person candidate interviews
- Candidate questionnaire
- Variable race factors

A candidate's political party affiliation is not a criterion for support.

Contributors to AGC PAC are encouraged to recommend candidates. You can register your support by contacting your state chairman, regional coordinator or the AGC PAC director by telephone, letter, or email.



AGC PAC IS YOUR PAC

Federal laws and regulations have a direct impact on you and your business. And because it is not legal for corporations and, in most cases, Chapter State PACs to make political contributions directly to federal candidates or to political parties, AGC PAC allows you the opportunity to have a national impact on federal elections. This is made possible by pooling our resources and dealing from a position of collective strength.

PAC FACTS

- An individual may give no more than \$5,000 to AGC PAC in a calendar year.
- AGC PAC may only solicit the restricted class (executive and administrative personnel, stockholders and the families of both groups) of our member companies with their prior approval.
- **Any contribution to AGC PAC is completely voluntary, and must be made with personal funds.**

Throughout the year, AGC PAC encouraged members to vote, and you made the voice of the construction industry heard on November 7th! Now is the time to capitalize on the successes of AGC PAC and put the same effort towards policy victories in the 110th Congress.

Candidate Contributions

AGC PAC is allowed to give \$5,000 per federal candidate, per election (primary, general or run-off). AGC PAC is not restricted to an aggregate contribution limit on total candidate support.

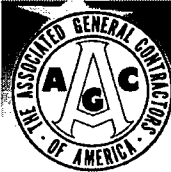
AGC PAC contributions to candidates vary in dollar amount depending upon all of the critical factors stated previously in criteria for support.

AGC PAC will support only one candidate in a specific race!

PAC contributors and chapters are encouraged to deliver AGC PAC checks directly to the candidates in their districts.

Reporting Requirements

AGC PAC is registered with the Federal Election Commission and reports monthly on all AGC PAC receipts and contributions to candidates. These reports become part of the public record at the FEC.



Make A Difference On Election Day

AGC PAC/GRASSROOTS MADE A DIFFERENCE ON ELECTION DAY 2006!

AGC PAC raised over \$1,040,000 dollars for the 2005-2006 Election Cycle.

SENATE: 55% win record. AGC PAC was involved in 22 out of 33 Senate races.

- Incumbent Races: 65% win record. Supported 17 incumbents, and 11 won.
- Open Seat Races: 33% win record. Supported 3 candidates, and 1 won.

HOUSE: 83% win record. AGC PAC was involved in 206 of the 435 House races.

- Incumbent Races: 87% win record. Supported 183 incumbents, and 160 won.
- Open Seat Races: 53% win record. Supported 19 open seat races, and 10 won.

AGC PAC conducted direct mail campaigns for 16 candidates this cycle.

- Nearly 12,000 individuals visited AGC's Legislative Action Center to obtain early voting information.
- Nearly 5,000 individuals visited AGC's Legislative Action Center to find their polling location.

- AGC hosted 425 meetings with congressional staff, administration officials and federal candidates, and hosted several chapter visits during the 2006 election cycle.
