

Training Cost Assumptions

- The methodology used to develop the training cost assumptions comes from the Lead Fees Rule, the 2008 Residential RRP Rule, and the Minor Amendments Rule.
- Some estimates were modified under the assumption that the P&CB rule training would be shorter, less intensive, and potentially not require in-class training (i.e, on-line training).
- Wage rates from BLS were used to calculate time burden.
- Federal per diem for meals and mileage rates were used to calculate travel cost.
- For travel distance, training is assumed to be within a reasonable driving distance (50 miles each way) with an overnight stay in a hotel not being required.

Range of Training Cost Estimates

Certified Renovator Initial Training

- On-line: \$145 (tuition - \$45, training time burden - \$100)
- Classroom: \$455.39 (tuition - \$90, training time burden - \$200, travel and meals - \$165.39)

Certified Renovator Refresher training

- On-line: \$70 (tuition - \$20, training time burden - \$50)
- Classroom: \$310.39 (tuition - \$45, training time burden - \$100, travel and meals - \$165.39)

Worker On the Job Training

- On-line: \$5 (assumes a time burden of 10 minutes)
- Classroom: \$15 (assumes a time burden 30 minutes)
