




3. How would you describe your current situation in filling salaried and hourly craft positions? Responses: 25








4. Do you expect any changes in the availability of hourly craft or salaried personnel over the coming 12 months? Responses: 25




5. Did your firm increase or decrease pay or benefits in 2020? (mark all that apply) Responses: 25







7. Did an owner postpone or cancel any projects that were scheduled to start in 2020 or 2021? (mark all that apply) Responses: 25




8. When do you expect your firm's volume of business will return to its normal level relative to one year earlier? Responses: 25







10. What challenges, if any, do you see regarding the safety and health of your firm's workers (mark all that apply)? Responses: 25




