HOLBROOK MUNICIPAL AIRPORT RECONSTRUCT RUNWAY 3/21

The COVID-19 pandemic hit during Sunland Asphalt & Construction's reconstruction project at the Holbrook Municipal Airport. Because of the pandemic, the neighboring Navajo Nation community was hard hit with increasing positive cases and had limited resources to slow the spread. Sunland teamed up with the charitable organization Wings of Faith, along with the Arizona Cardinals, Empire CAT and AGC's Arizona Chapter to collect non-perishable goods, cleaning supplies, personal protective equipment, school supplies and \$6,500 in monetary donations. They arranged for 27 planes to deliver nearly 10,000 pounds of donated supplies with the help of over 50 volunteers.

VIRTUAL COMMUNITY WEEK

Barton Malow

With the country gripped in the COVID-19 pandemic, unemployment growing and the needs of the communities rising, Barton Malow wanted to help as many people as possible through virtual activities and several safe in-person volunteer opportunities. Options for volunteer opportunities included working with the American Red Cross, Library of Congress, Smithsonian, Census Bureau, and writing letters to senior centers, deployed military and front-line workers. Six hundred fifty Barton Malow employees volunteered during this weeklong community outreach effort.

SECOND HARVEST FOOD BANK PARTNERSHIP

Barriere partnered with the non-profit Second Harvest and St. John the Baptist Parish to provide 1,200 boxes of nutritious, shelf-stable food supplies that could each feed a family of four for several meals. This fundraising effort was able to provide for approximately 450 families in need. In addition, Barriere was able to donate 150 cases of canned beans to the victims of Hurricane Laura which approximately fed 10,000 people.
