"Industry: The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) only reports construction employment combined with mining and logging in most metros, because of small sample sizes or to preserve confidentiality for industries with few employers. Metro data is not seasonally adjusted.

"History: Red dots are peaks and Blue dots are troughs. If a trough or peak value occurs multiple times, it appears multiple times on the line. The Previous Highest and Lowest columns show the most recent occurrence. The BLS began reporting construction employment in 1990 for 344 metro areas; data for 14 more areas were added in 1992–2005.
