To the AGC of America Family:

This year, the Foundation will support four more faculty members, in partnership with the AGC contractors who employ them for the summer months. That brings the total number of these great experiences for faculty members and contractors alike to 19 since we started this initiative in 2011. We would like to encourage

more contractors to get involved in this outstanding program. While we are obviously proud of our signature scholarship program over the past 40 years, having supported over 4,000 students with almost \$10 million in scholarships, we are aware that for each faculty internship we support, potentially thousands of students will benefit directly from the knowledge that the professors gain from real world experience!

Similarly, our industry case studies will have a great impact on students, allowing faculty and trainers to access these studies for use in the classroom to augment existing curricula. Our first case study, prepared by a team from the University of Northern Kentucky and Turner Construction, "Ethics in Project Planning and Execution," is available in the AGC Bookstore at no charge. Another case study on lean construction is in progress at Pittsburg State and this year we have awarded contracts to three new teams. Our goal is to have a library of this work available to AGC members and faculty.

Speaking of scholarships, we are delighted to announce at the 97th AGC Convention the **award of 145 scholarships** for the 2016-17 academic year. This year's recipients include a record number of graduate students, helping us to fulfill the goal of bringing more faculty into the classroom with a solid construction background. The continuing generosity of our long-time donors and the establishment of new endowments have made it possible to help these young people with the rising costs of their college educations.

In 2015 the foundation awarded the first 19 Workforce Development Scholarships for students in craft and technical programs. This new scholarship supported by the National Center for Construction and Education Research

(NCCER) allows us to make a contribution addressing the industry's workforce shortage. We are looking for more AGC members to help us by supporting this exciting endeavor. I hope you will consider becoming a contributor.

Safety has become a focus of our work in 2015. The AGC Safety Committee has worked to establish a fund to support the first-ever construction safety degree program at Keene State College in New Hampshire. Turner Construction has committed \$100,000 to support the effort. Beyond that, the Board of Certified Safety Professionals has contributed to a scholarship for students whose construction focus is safety

The Foundation's work continues to promote the cultivation of our future leaders and to recognize outstanding work in construction education. That is our mission. We are grateful for the continued and significant financial support by AGC members and firms, the Consulting Constructors Council and AGC of America that allows us to do that. We extend a special thanks to Alliant, David Dando, Doug Maibach and Les Snyder for establishing new endowed scholarship funds in 2015, as well as the Construction Leadership Council (CLC), Bob Fay, FMI Corporation, Scott and Karen Holloway and Lee and Connie Kearney who substantially increased their endowments this past year.

We are grateful to AGC's Past Presidents, who through their generosity established a fund in honor of the late Rick Brown, whose work to support the foundation far exceeded his role as an AGC staff member for 40 years. That fund was supported as well by many of Rick's friends, family and AGC colleagues. Another fund established by colleagues and friends of Thomas Giardini, honors this past president of the Associated Construction Company and past president of AGC of Connecticut.

BRYAN J HUBBARD Bryan Hubbard is Department Head and Associate Professor in the Building Construction and Management (BCM) Program at Purdue University where he teaches courses in plan reading, estimating, and industrial construction. Hubbard's research interests include construction safety, industrial and nuclear construction, and workforce training. He has received research grants from the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) to further research in the area of construction safety and also from the Department of Labor to promote construction worker safety training. Prior to working in BCM, Hubbard worked at Purdue in the Civil Engineering Department and the Construction Engineering and

Management Program teaching and working with industry.

Prior to coming to Purdue, he worked as an engineer in industry, with design and construction experience in the United States and Europe, including large scale projects in the power industry. Hubbard was the lead inventor on a new process for water purification and desalination in industrial cooling systems and holds two patents. He received his Ph.D. in civil engineering from Texas A& M University and his master's (MSE) and bachelor's degrees (BSME) from Purdue University, and is licensed as a professional engineer in the State of Indiana.

KRIS YOUNG Kris Young is the second of three generations to work in the horizontal boring business founded by her father Gene in 1948. Kris started with the company in 1974 and was named President of Miller The Driller in 1982. Upon Gene's retirement in 2004, her son Brandon, an experienced driller in his own right, moved up to VP of Operations and Kris assumed role of CEO. Miller The Driller pioneered many of the means and methods used today in the trenchless industry. The company has installed horizontal tunnels from coast to coast using auger boring, directional drilling, and tunnel boring machine methods. Millers installed a world record 147" diameter tunnel by the pipe ramming method in 2003.

Young has been a member of the AGC of Iowa and the AGC of America for most of her career in underground construction. She's been active in many capacities including state and national committee memberships and served as President of AGC of Iowa in 1995 as well as President of AGC of America in 2011.

Dr. Dennis C. Bausman has over 35 years of experience in construction and construction education. Currently, he serves as Professor and Endowed Faculty Chair in the Construction Science & Management Department at Clemson University. Prior to joining the faculty at Clemson University, he was in large commercial contracting where he held Division and Project Management positions over a 22 year career in industry. Dr. Bausman is an AIC Certified Professional Constructor and serves as a member of the board for the American Institute of

Constructors and as Chair of the Constructor Certification Commission. He has received national recognition for his work including AGC's National Outstanding Educator Award, the Associated Schools of Construction's (ASC) Outstanding Researcher Award, ASC's National Teaching Award, and the W.A. 
