**Our first case study,** prepared by a team from the University of Northern Kentucky and Turner Construction, "Ethics in Project Planning and Execution," is available in the AGC Bookstore at no charge to faculty or training professionals. Another case study is in progress at Pittsburg State and we will issue an RFP for a third in the fall of this year. We are starting to build the library we envisioned at the inception of this initiative in 2012.

We are announcing at the 96th AGC convention the **award of 114 scholarships** for the 2015-16 academic year. This year's recipients include a

record number of graduate students, helping us to fulfill the goal of bringing more faculty into the classroom with a solid construction background. The continuing generosity of our long-time donors and the establishment of new endowments have made it possible to help these young people with the high costs of their college educations.

Our big announcement for this year is the launch of Workforce Development Scholarships for students in craft and technical programs. The Foundation, approached by the National Center for Construction and Education Research with a donation to support such scholarships, took it a step further and developed, with NCCER's help, a new scholarship program. We are looking for other partners to help us with this exciting endeavor—please consider supporting this important initiative to addressing the industry's workforce shortage.

The Foundation's work continues to promote the cultivation of our future leaders and to recognize outstanding work in construction education. That is our mission. We are grateful for the continued and significant financial support by AGC members and firms, the Consulting Constructors Council and AGC of America that allows us to do that. 
### RAY BUYLE | 2015 OUTSTANDING EDUCATOR

Assistant Professor, Architectural Engineering and Construction Science Kansas State University
