Deadline for completed applications to be received at AGC of America: **5 p.m. EST on Friday, Oct. 9, 2015**.

Be sure to answer all questions completely. Please use complete sentences to ensure your narrative explains your project in an interesting, compelling manner. Grammar, spelling and completeness of the application (including such additions as letters, articles, videos & photos) *will* count toward your final score.

All <u>applications must use the OSC application form</u> in order to qualify; this ensures that the judges have consistent applications from competing Student Chapters.
