SURVEY SAYS...



68% of respondents reported at least one crash involving a moving vehicle at a highway work zone they operated in the past 12 months.



17% (down from 28% in 2019) reported construction worker injuries as a result of the crash.

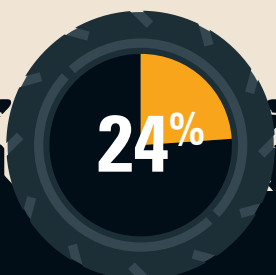


5% (down from 8% in 2019) reported construction worker fatalities as a result of the crash.

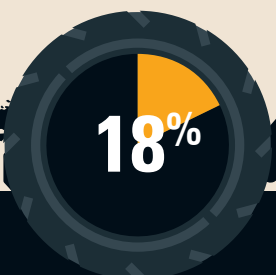


58% say highway work zones have been safer in 2020 due to fewer vehicles on the road as a result COVID-19.

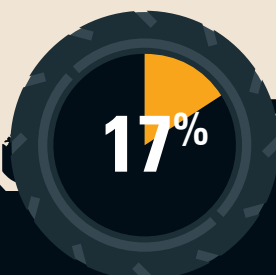
WHAT WOULD HELP REDUCE THE NUMBER OF CRASHES, INJURIES, AND/OR FATALITIES IN WORK ZONES?



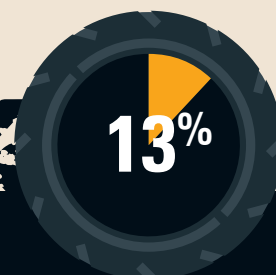
Greater police presence at work zone construction sites
