

Why Five-S?

- Makes work easier
- Increases productivity by reducing wasted effort
- Increases quality
- Increases reliability in task performance
- Helps keep work areas clean and tidy
- Increases emphasis on safety, quality, production, and learning

AGC Contractors have reported upwards of a 15% increase in productivity when implementing Five-S principals







Messy Sites Create Safety Hazards and Impacts Productivity



What is Five-S?



- Sort
- Straighten/Set in Order
- Sweep / Shine
- Standardize / Schedule
- Sustain / Discipline / Improve



Sort

 Review your work areas and keep only the items you need (you may add items back when you have a need)






Straighten


- Organize your work areas and tool cribs
- Make the organization visual, by use & frequency
- Ensure tools & equipment are put in the same place every time
- Make it mobile
- Find items easier and faster





Sweep




- Clean your workspaces and equipment continuously as you work
- Maintain clean and tidy work areas
- Clean areas allow you to see issues
- A Clean Site is a Safe Site

Standardize

- Develop a plan to keep your work areas clean and organized
- Standardize your set-ups so everyone can find what they need and best practices are shared
- Assign responsibility to crew members
- This plan will ensure that your team is maintaining the Five-S program





Sustain



- Set up inspections to ensure the program is being kept up
- Display the results of the inspections
- Keep the program active. Don't let your efforts fade away
- Make the first Four S's a habit
- Improve each of the first Four S's by making each easier to perform





- 1. Keep work areas clean and organized
- Maintain orderly tool cribs and equipment yards
- 3. Identify & eliminate waste
- Only stock materials in the work area that will be needed within 48 hours
- 5. Keep all stored materials on mobile carts or skids
- 6. Involve the whole team
- 7. Fight Complacency! Keep the program active!
- 8. A Clean Jobsite is a Safe Jobsite
