




How would you describe your current situation in filling salaried and hourly craft positions?Responses: 21







4. Do you expect any changes in the availability of hourly craft or salaried personnel over the coming 12 months? Responses: 21














8. Did an owner postpone or cancel any projects that were scheduled to start in 2021 or 2022? (mark all that apply) Responses: 21




9. If projects were postponed or canceled, what was the main reason? Responses: 14




10. When do you expect your firm's volume of business will return to its normal level relative to one year earlier? Responses: 21






12. What challenges, if any, do you see regarding the safety and health of your firm's workers (mark all that apply)? Responses: 21






15. Does your firm currently have a formal IT plan to support your business objectives? Responses: 21




16. What are your biggest IT challenges (mark all that apply)? Responses: 21




17. Does your firm use cloud-hosted technology in any of the following ways (mark all that apply)? Responses: 21




