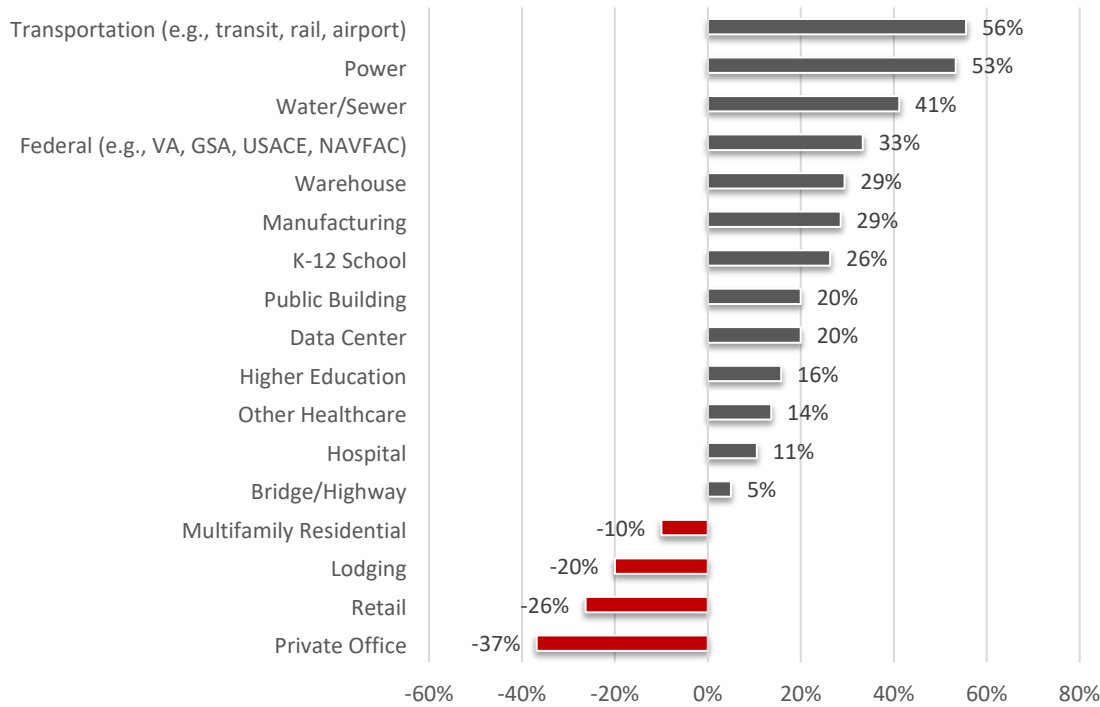

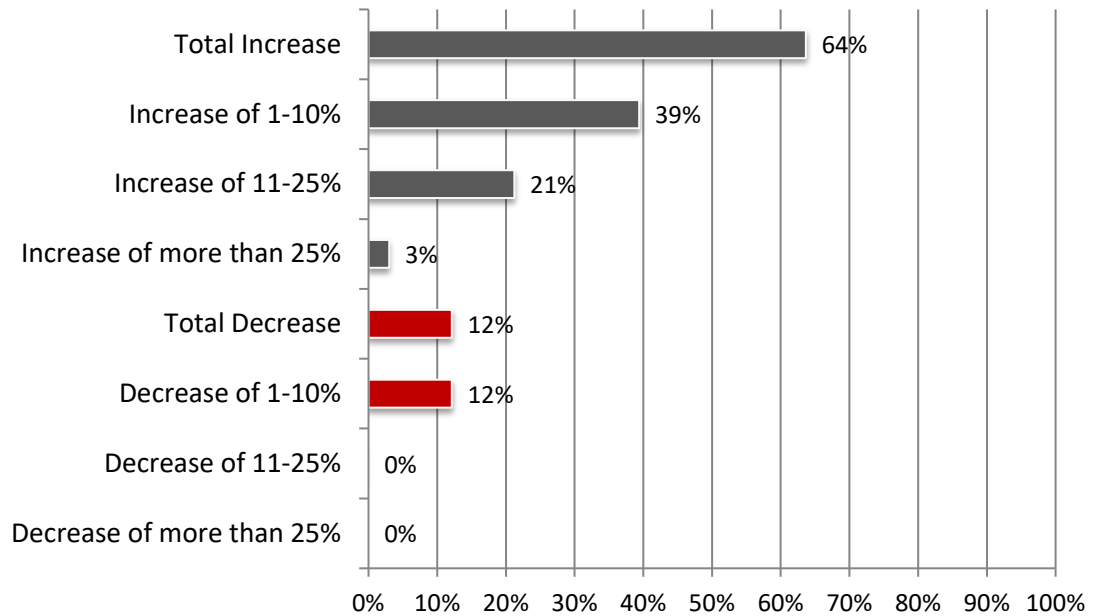

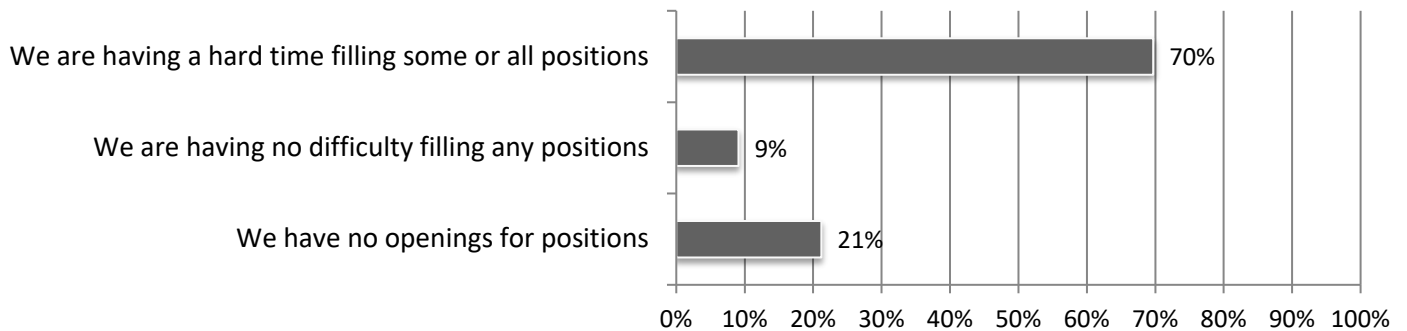

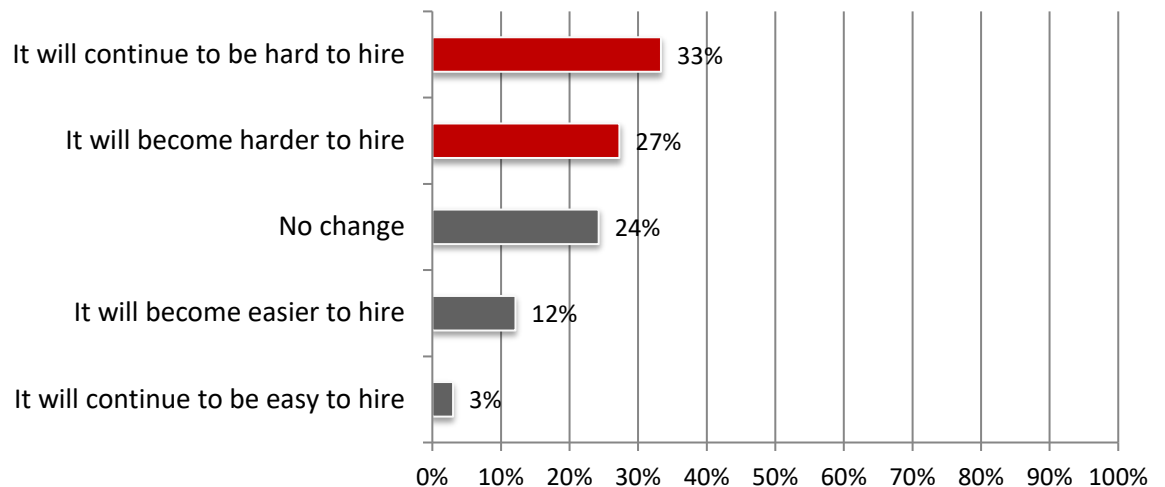

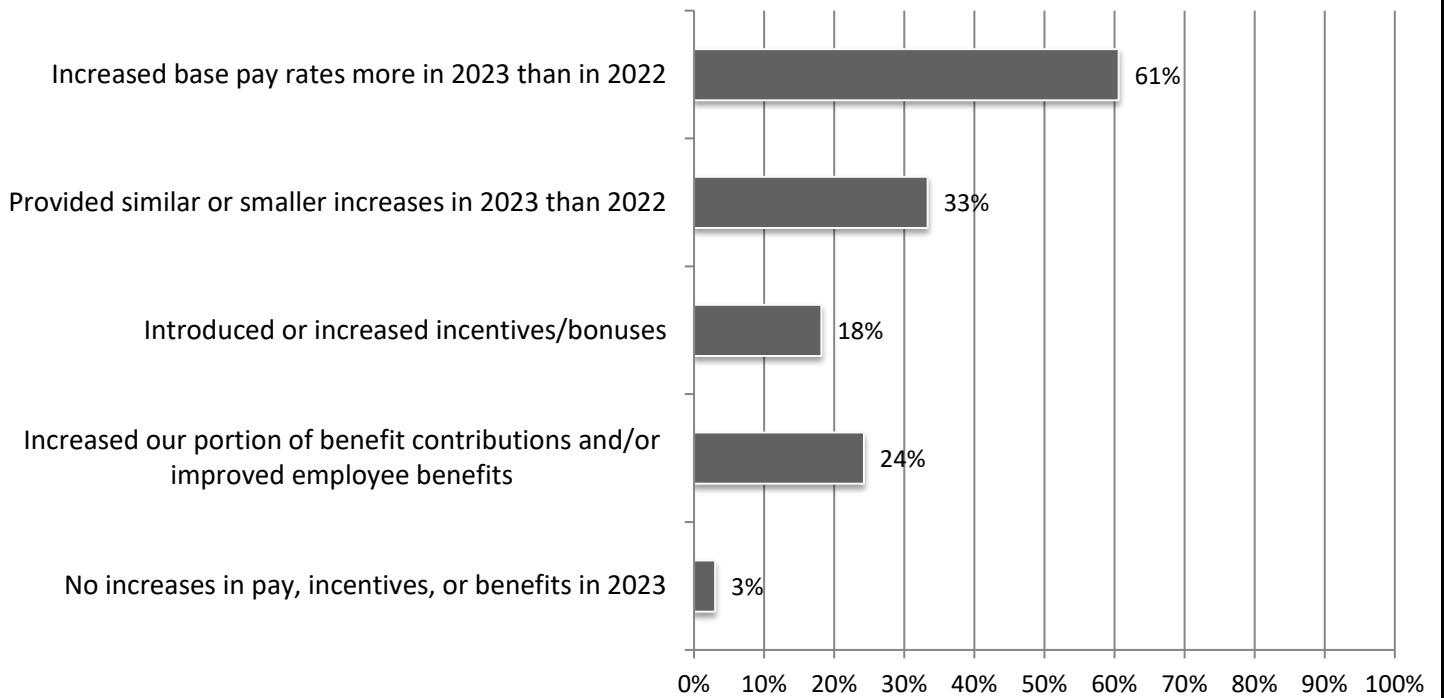
**3. How would you describe your current situation in filling salaried and hourly craft positions? Responses: 33**



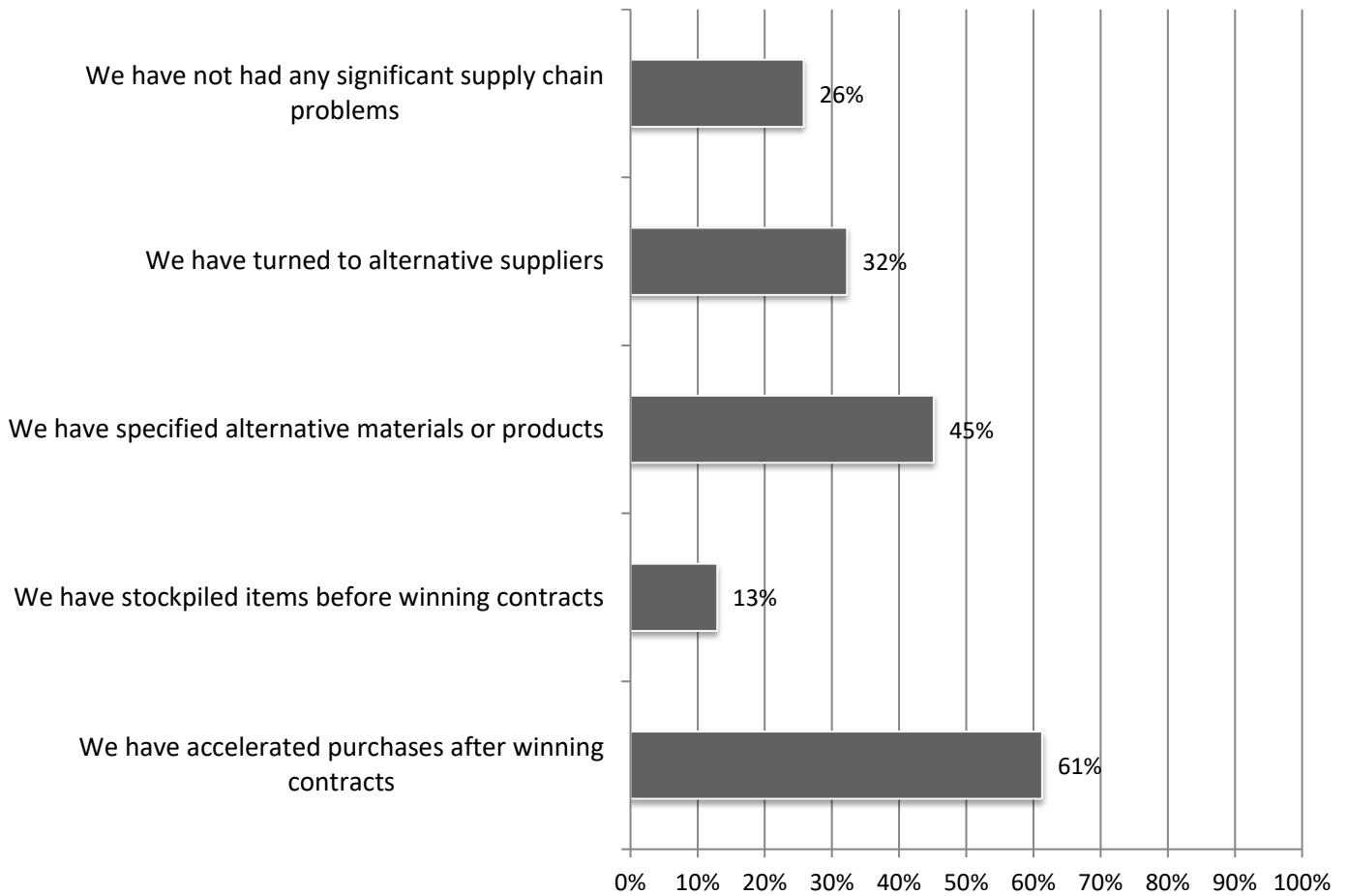
**4. Do you expect any changes in the availability of hourly craft or salaried personnel over the coming 12 months? Responses: 33**



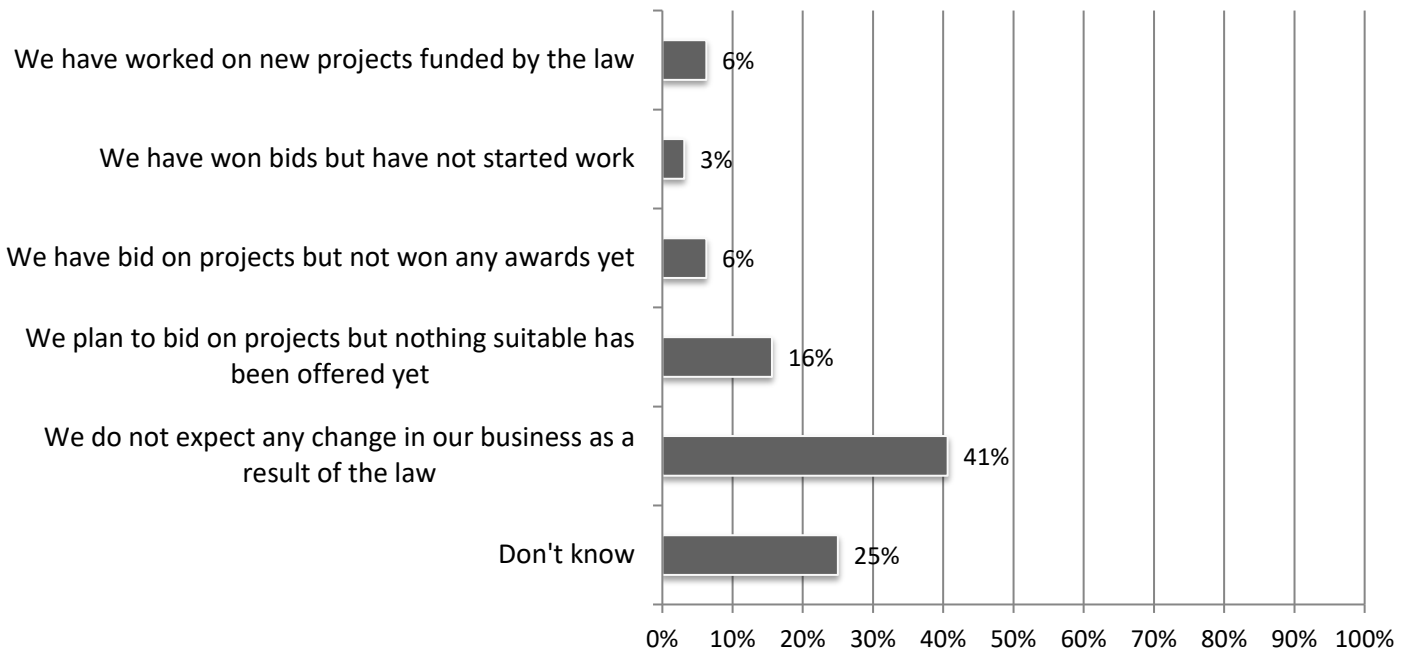
**5. What changes did your firm make in pay or benefits in 2023? (mark all that apply) Responses: 33**



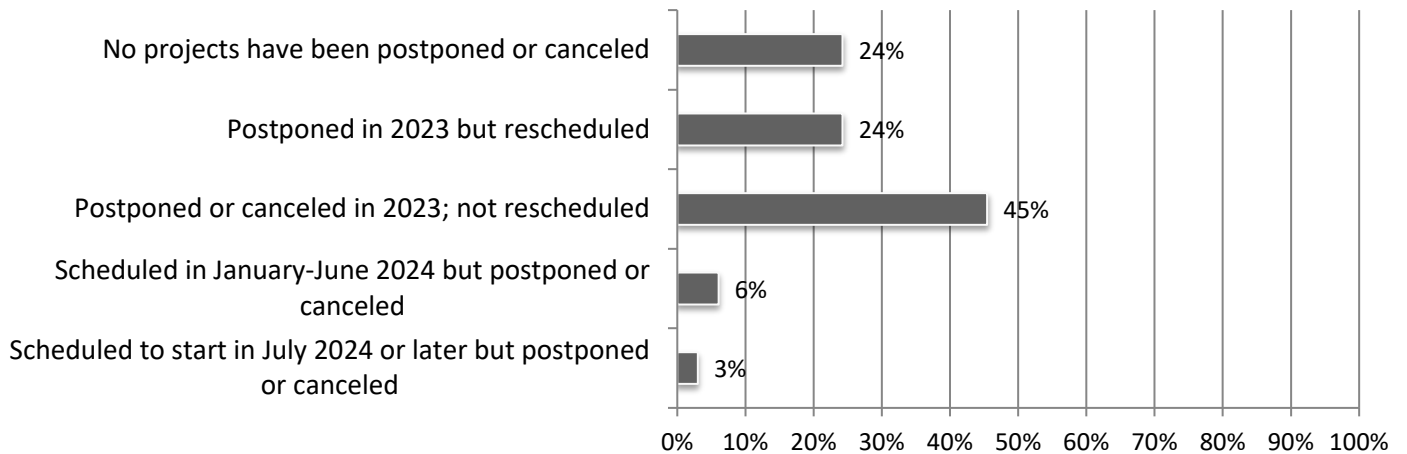
**6. How has your firm responded to supply-chain issues, if any? (mark all that apply) Responses: 31**



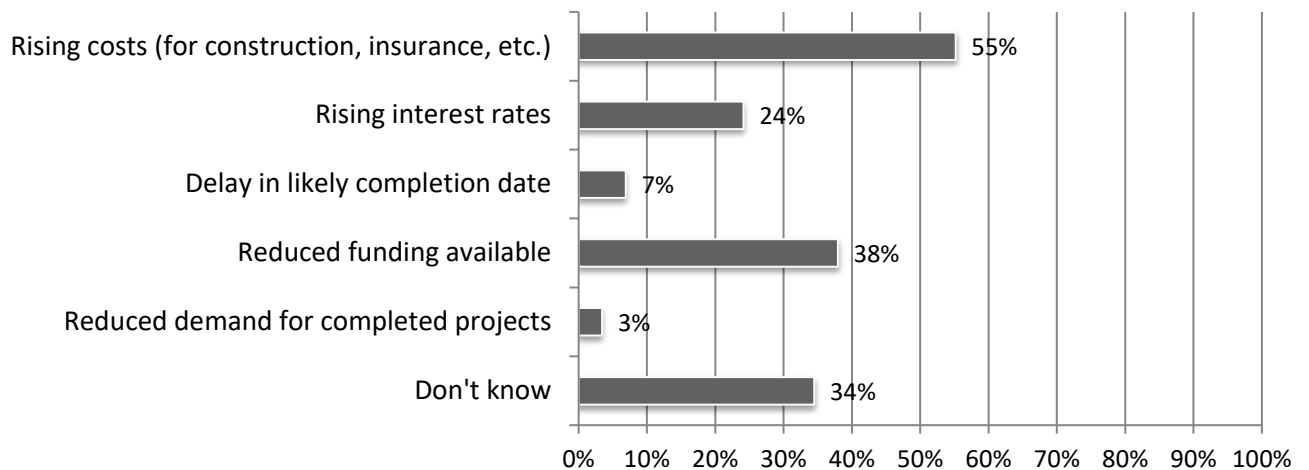

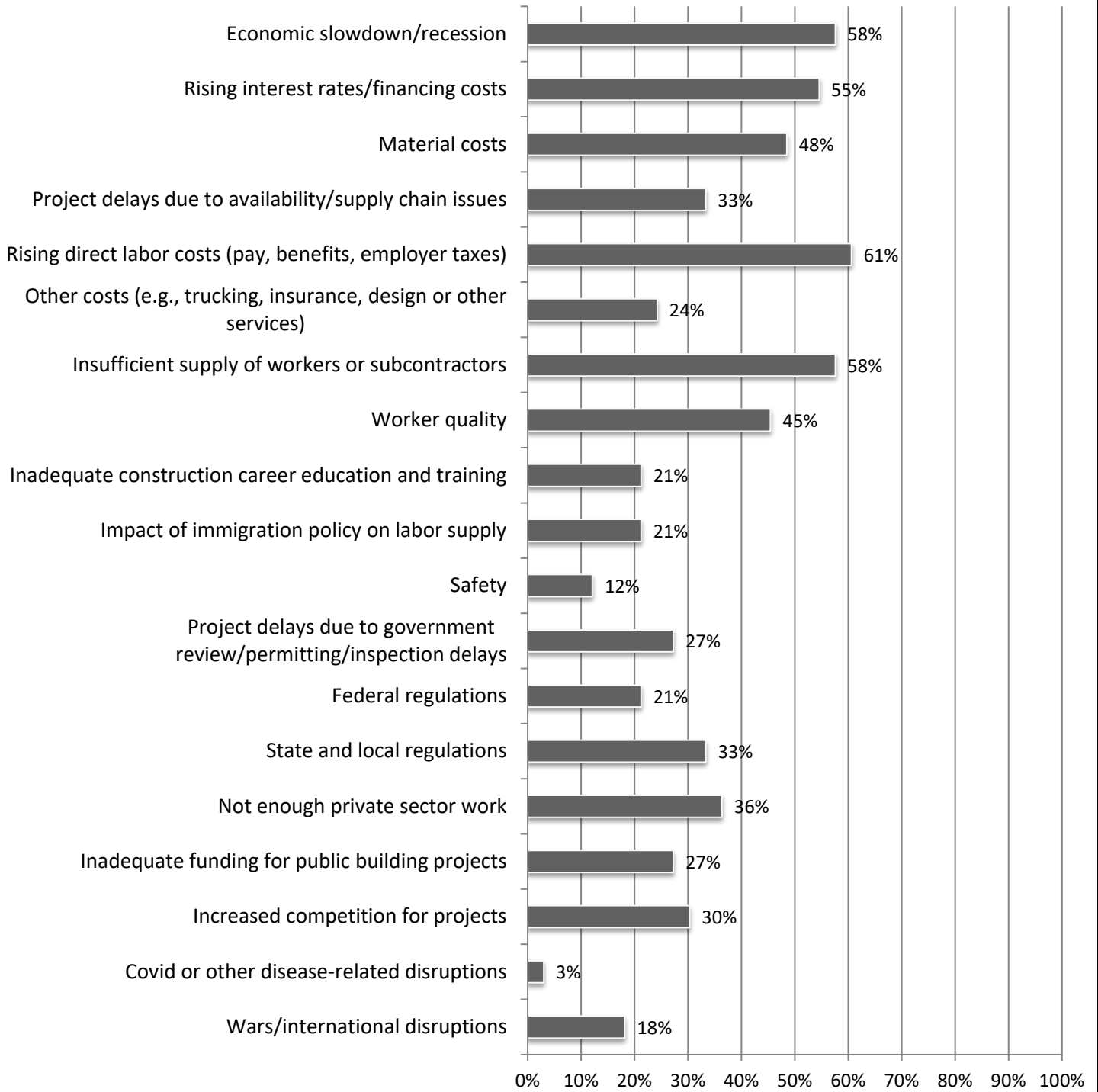
**8. Did an owner postpone or cancel any projects that were scheduled to start in 2023 or 2024? (mark all that apply) Responses: 33**



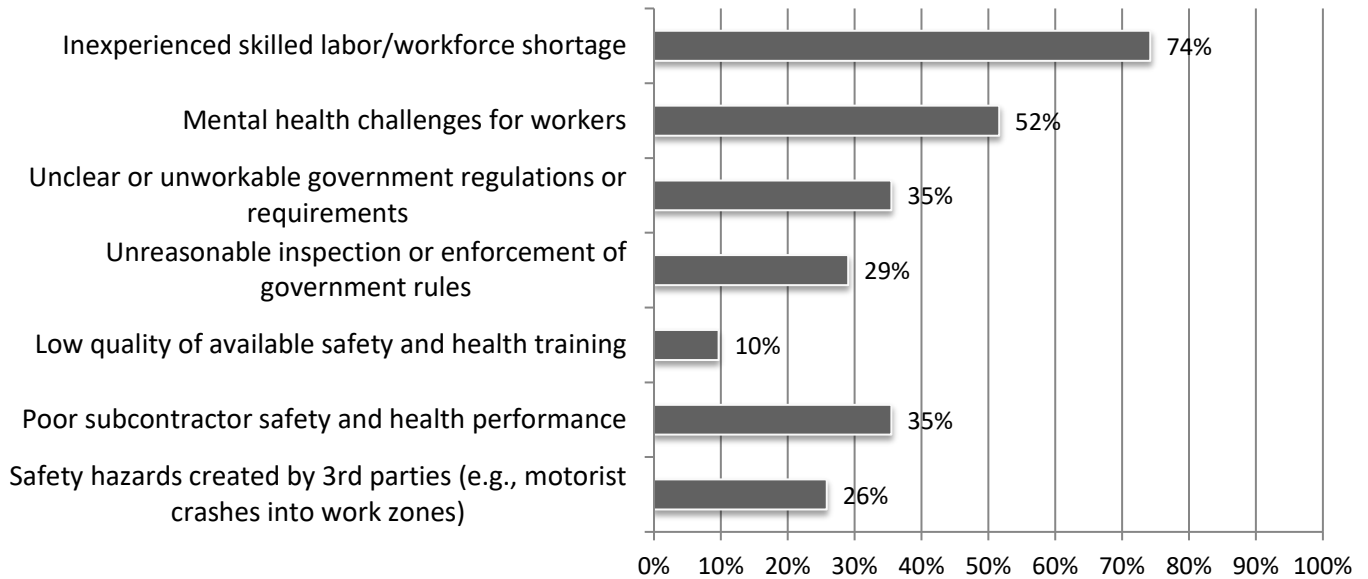

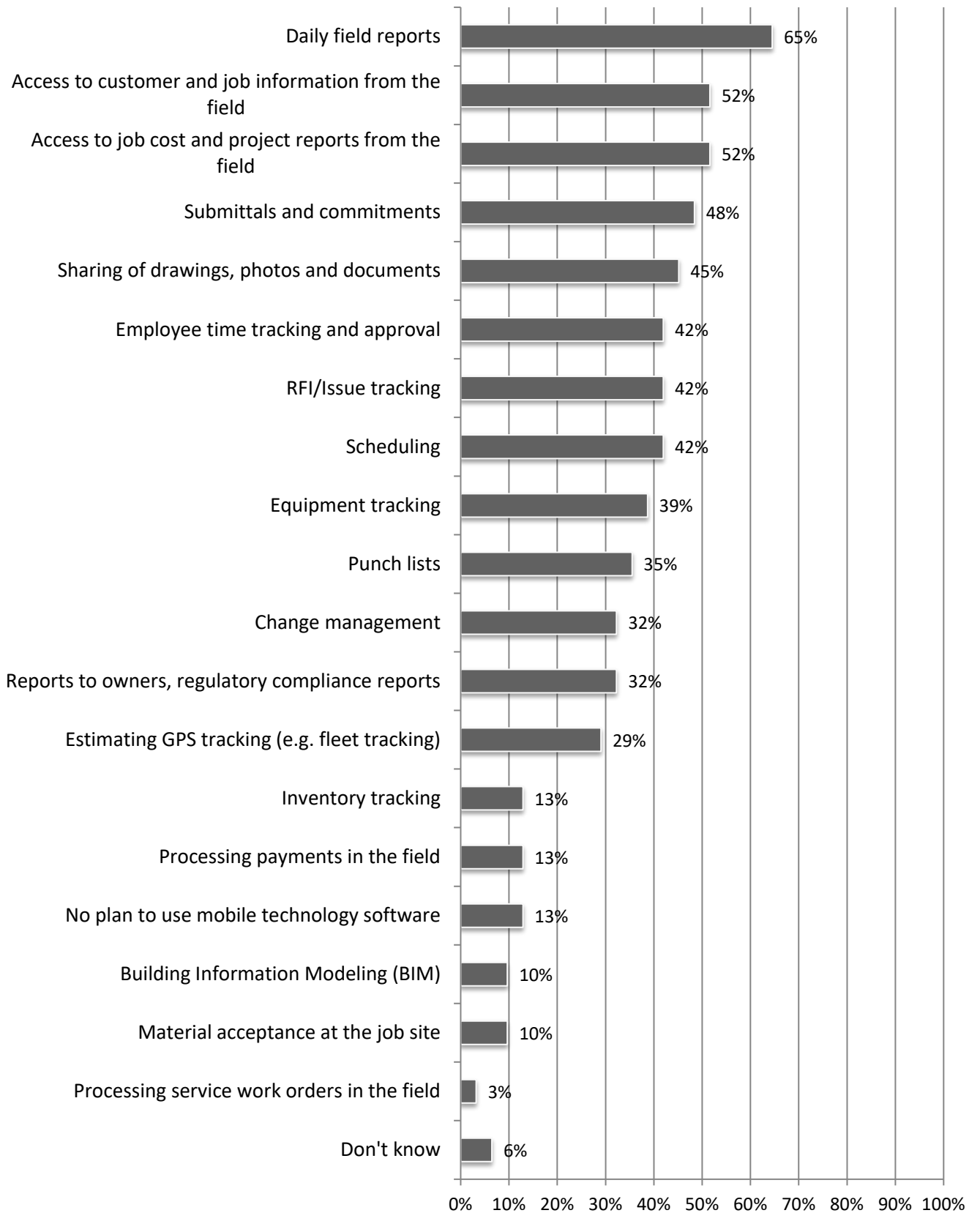

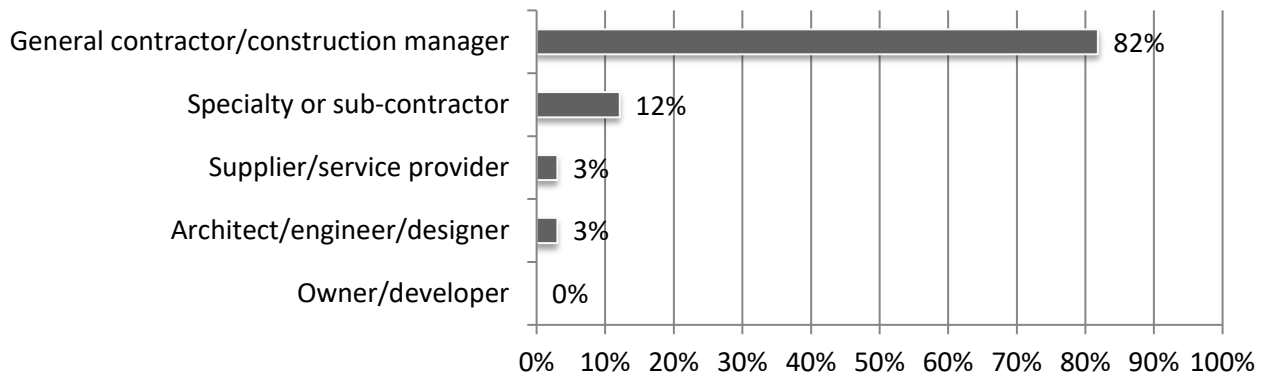
