MISSION STATEMENT

The AGC Education and Research Foundation shall advance and support education in the construction industry and support or contribute to scientific or research projects and programs deemed to be beneficial to the advancement of technological, educational, or vocational expertise in the industry.

UNAUDITED FINANCIALS

The AGC Education and Research Foundation had another successful year in 2025. The Foundation raised roughly \$953,000 in 2025. The Annual CCC Gala, held at the AGC of America Convention, was once again a success, raising a total of \$376,000 through sponsorships and donations. The Foundation's investments showed positive returns during the year and the Foundation ended the year with roughly \$2.4 million in net investment income. The Foundation awarded scholarships and awards of approximately \$826,000.

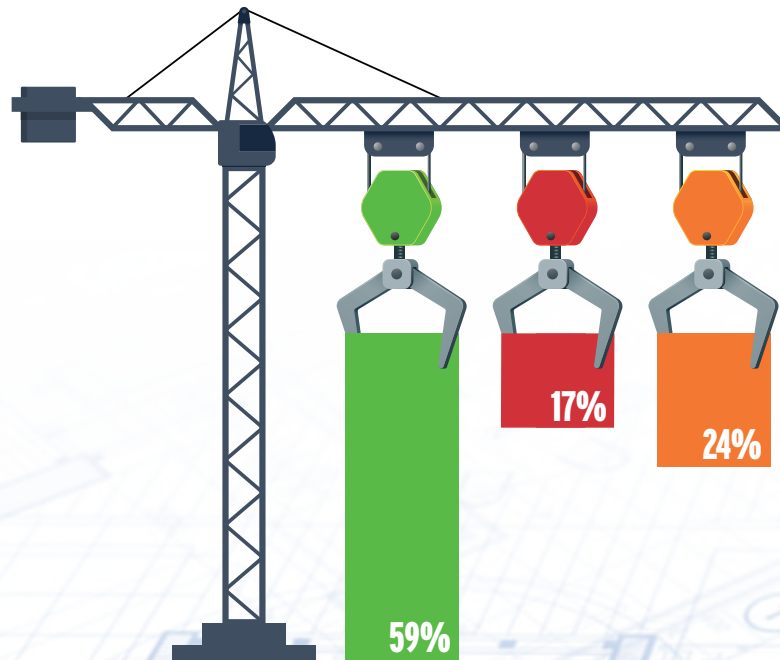
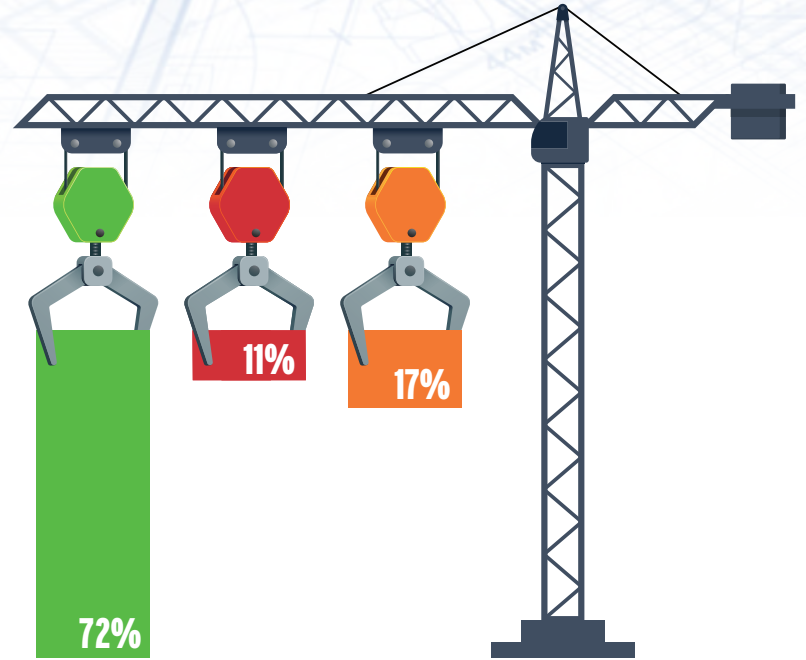

2025 ANNUAL REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

The AGC Education and Research Foundation offers undergraduate and graduate level scholarships to students enrolled in ABET or ACCE-accredited construction management or construction-related engineering programs. Over \$12 million in scholarships have been awarded to more than 5,500 students attending colleges and universities across the country.

In 2025, the AGC Education and Research Foundation awarded a total of \$739,125 in scholarship support, directly investing in the next generation of construction professionals. This included \$633,125 distributed to 152 undergraduate students, \$70,000 awarded to 13 graduate students, and \$36,000 supporting 23 workforce development scholarship recipients, helping students and craft professionals advance their education and careers across the construction industry. This impact would not be possible without the generosity of hundreds of donors, endowed scholarship partners, and industry supporters who continue to invest in the next generation of construction leaders.

Bowen Industry Residency Program, a unique initiative that embeds faculty directly within leading construction firms to strengthen the connection between academia and practice. Made possible through partnerships among educational institutions, AGC contractors, and the Foundation, these residencies provide hands-on industry experience that directly enhances classroom instruction and student preparation. Since the program's launch in 2011, the Foundation has proudly supported **60 industry residents**, helping to bridge education and real-world construction leadership.

BOWEN PRIZE FOR GREAT BUILDERS – INAUGURAL YEAR

In 2025, the AGC Education and Research Foundation proudly launched the **Bowen Prize for Great Builders**, a national recognition program created to honor the construction industry's most outstanding field leaders—those whose hands-on expertise, leadership, and problem-solving skills bring some of America's most complex infrastructure projects to life. The inaugural Bowen Prize was awarded to **Michael Svoboda of Kiewit Infrastructure** for his exceptional leadership on the Broadway Bridge Replacement Project in Nashville. In recognition of his achievement, the Foundation awarded a \$50,000 gift to the University of Wyoming's Construction Management Program, Svoboda's alma mater, transforming professional excellence into a lasting investment in future builders.

The gift establishes a new internship award for Construction Management students at the University of Wyoming, designed to recognize and reward excellence in hands-on industry experience. In addition to financial support, recipients may be honored through commemorative recognition, feature stories in institutional publications, and professional development opportunities such as travel support to attend industry conferences—helping students connect classroom learning to real-world careers.

Endowed by a **\$1 million gift from Bob Bowen**, founder of Bowen Engineering, the Bowen Prize elevates the visibility of accomplished project executives whose innovation, stewardship, and field-driven leadership often go unrecognized. Debuting at the 2025 AGC Annual Convention in Columbus, Ohio, the Bowen Prize marks the beginning of a lasting tradition—one that celebrates the great builders shaping the nation's built environment while inspiring the next generation to follow in their footsteps.

OUTSTANDING EDUCATOR AWARD

The AGC Education & Research Foundation awarded **Larry Fickel** with the 2025 Outstanding Educator Award. Larry is a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Construction Science at Texas A&M University, where he brings more than 35 years of field experience into the classroom. His teaching focuses on Construction Project Controls and

leadership in the design and construction fields. Larry serves as the faculty advisor for the Texas A&M University Student Chapter of the Associated General Contractors (AGC), which celebrated its 75th anniversary this year, and notably served as president of the chapter as a student in 1981. Prior to becoming a professor, Larry held roles ranging from carpenter to operations manager and director, working on projects including industrial facilities, residential developments, water and wastewater treatment plants, and road and bridge infrastructure. As part of his award, Larry received a \$5,000 cash award and named two students as recipients of \$2,500 scholarships. In addition, Larry attended the annual AGC Convention as a guest of the Foundation.

AGC EDUCATION AND RESEARCH FOUNDATION'S WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

The AGC Education and Research Foundation's Workforce Development Scholarships help students like 2025 scholarship winner **Titan Marchand** (pictured) a full-time electrical construction student at Nunez Community College who combines classroom learning with hands-on industry experience. He has earned multiple technical certifications, worked extensively in the electrical field, and demonstrates leadership through mentoring a high school robotics team and community service. Titan's strong work ethic, commitment to his craft, and perseverance in continuing his education despite financial challenges reflect the purpose and impact of the Workforce Development Scholarship program. The Foundation awarded 23 Workforce Scholarships in 2025 totaling \$36,000 over two years.



2025 JAMES L. ALLHANDS ESSAY CONTEST

Chloe Kildea from East Carolina University was awarded First Place in the James L. Allhands Essay Contest for her essay, "How AI Is Changing Construction." The faculty advisor for this essay was Ronald Chance. As part of her award, Chloe received a \$1,000 cash award, and her faculty advisor received \$500. Both Chloe and her faculty advisor attended the annual AGC Convention as guests of the Foundation.

2025 W.A. KLINGER AWARD

The 2025 W.A. Klinger Award winner is **Chris Zoz** from **Iowa State University**.

Chris made the most of his time in Iowa State's Construction Engineering program by staying heavily involved across student organizations, academics, competitions, and department services. A consistent presence in the Iowa State AGC student chapter for all four years, Chris also served in a cabinet leadership position for two years, supporting chapter initiatives while staying engaged with peers and industry.

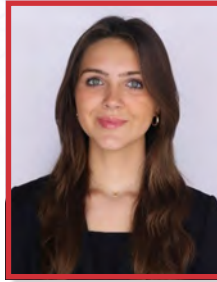

In the classroom, Chris invested in the success of other students through his work as a Teaching Assistant for ConE 4410: Construction Planning, Scheduling, and Control, serving two semesters in a role that strengthened both his technical foundation and his ability to communicate project controls concepts clearly. He also represented the department as a CCEE Student Ambassador for two years, helping connect prospective students and families with opportunities in Construction Engineering at Iowa State.

Chris also tested his skills in high-pressure, real-world problem-solving environments through national competitions. He competed in the ASC Region 4 Commercial Division, earning both a 1st and 3rd place finish, and expanded that experience by competing in the ASC Regions 6 & 7 Project Management Competition, where his team earned 2nd place. Beyond competitions, he strengthened the program through undergraduate research and by serving as a student member of the Construction Engineering Curriculum Committee, contributing a student perspective to ongoing program improvements.

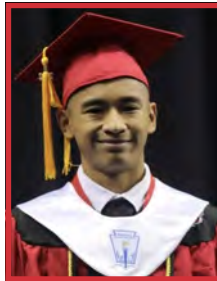

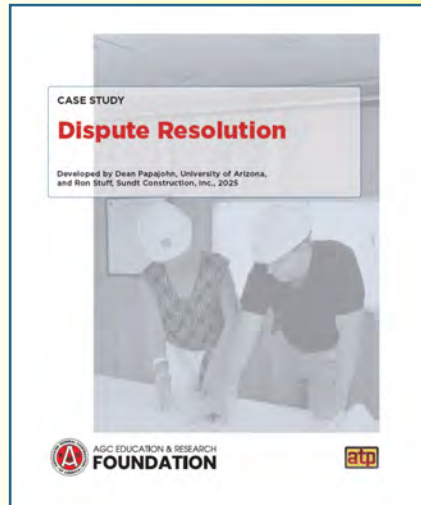
